| Plant Type: | Herbaceous Perennial |
| Height / Width: | 1.5-3 ft. H x 1-2 ft. W |
| Plant Form: | Erect clumps, spreading |
| Flower / Fruit: | Large, upward facing, fragrant, bright yellow flowers with long, outward curving spurs |
| Leaf Color, Size: | Lacy, green-gray, with finely toothed edges |
| Native To: | Arizona, New Mexico, Mexico |

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

| Sunset Zones: | 1-24 |
| Soil: | Well-drained, average fertility |
| Water: | Best with regular water |
| Sun: | Light shade to full shade |
| Care and Pruning: | After bloom, cut back old stems for 2nd flowering, replace every 3-4 years. Reseeds prolifically. |
