| Plant Type: | Deciduous Shrub |
| Height / Width: | 7-9 ft. H x 12 ft. W or more |
| Plant Form: | Multi-stemmed, upright with a suckering/colonizing habit |
| Flower / Fruit: | Small, creamy white flowers in 2-inch clusters, in summer White or bluish fruit follow |
| Leaf Color, Size: | Oval, 1½-2½-in.-long, fresh deep green; yellow branches |
| Native To: | Northern California to Alaska |

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

| Sunset Zones: | 1-9, 14-21 |
| Soil: | Well-drained, moist |
| Water: | Regular |
| Sun: | Partial shade |
| Care and Pruning: | For strong branch color, prune out oldest branches annually in January |

Grown for striking winter stems. Plant along banks of ponds or streams, against a backdrop of conifers or an expanse of lawn
