

Graptopetalum paraguayense

Ghost Plant or Mother of Pearl Plant



PLANT DESCRIPTION

Plant Type: Succulent Perennial

Height/Width: 7 in. H x 12 in. W

Plant Form: Spreading

Flower / Fruit: $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. star-shaped white or yellow flowers on branching stems

Leaf Color, Size: Fleshy, pointed leaves grow along woody trailing stems and form rosettes ranging in color from pale blue gray (in bright shade) to yellow pink (in full hot sun)

Native To: Mexico

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

Sunset Zones: 13, 16-17, 19-24 or indoors

Soil: Coarse, well-drained soil that goes dry between waterings

Water: Little

Sun: Full sun or partial shade or high light indoors

Care and Pruning: Plants grow readily from cuttings; handle with care as leaves break off easily

GARDEN USE Suitable as groundcover with no foot traffic, as filler for hanging baskets and in rock gardens or cascading over walls
