

Hesperaloe parviflora Red Yucca



PLANT DESCRIPTION

Plant Type:	Perennial succulent
Height/Width:	3-4 ft. H x 3-4 ft. W
Plant Form:	Arching clumps
Flower / Fruit:	5 ft. arching stalks with many rose red to bright red flowers from late spring thru midsummer, sometimes into early fall
Leaf:	Leathery, long, dark green narrow leaves have deep grooves and white frayings at the margins
Native To:	Texas and New Mexico

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

Sunset Zones:	2b, 3, 7-16, 18-24
Soil:	Tolerates most soil types
Water:	Drought tolerant. Blooms better with some irrigation in summer. Sensitive to overwatering.
Sun:	Full sun, even reflective heat, especially heat tolerant
Care and Pruning:	Require little maintenance, only removal of spent flower clusters

GARDEN USE

Use around pools, in xeriscaping, as single specimen or in mass planting. Excellent container plant. Attracts hummingbirds!
