| Plant Type: | Perennial Grass |
| Height / Width: | 5 ft. H x 5 ft. W |
| Plant Form: | Arching, soft clump |
| Flower / Fruit: | Amber flower spikes arching 2 ft. above foliage in autumn, fading to gray |
| Leaf: | Narrow, blue-green; semiever- green in mild winter areas |
| Native To: | Texas, Mexico |

| Sunset Zones: | 6-24 |
| Soil: | Variety of soils |
| Water: | Little or no water to moderate. Very drought tolerant, but looks better and grows larger with moderate supplemental water. |
| Sun: | Full sun to light shade |
| Care and Pruning: | Cut back in Feb-March when new growth begins |
