## Sinaloa Sage



### PLANT DESCRIPTION

<b>Plant Type:</b>	<b>Perennial</b>
<b>Height / Width:</b>	<b>1 ft. H x 1-2 ft. W</b>
<b>Plant Form:</b>	<b>Low mounding, dense</b>
<b>Flower / Fruit:</b>	<b>Neon blue, with 2 small white patches on lower lip, persistent wine-colored calyxes, in summer, often repeating in fall</b>
<b>Leaf:</b>	<b>Closely spaced, purple, lance-shaped, finely toothed, 1 in. long</b>
<b>Native To:</b>	<b>Western coastal Mexico</b>

### GROWING REQUIREMENTS

<b>Sunset Zones:</b>	<b>15-17, 20-24</b>
<b>Soil:</b>	<b>Well-drained</b>
<b>Water:</b>	<b>Regular</b>
<b>Sun:</b>	<b>Part shade</b>
<b>Care and Pruning:</b>	<b>Shear back near ground just as new spring growth emerges from base</b>
