

Salvia uliginosa

Bog Sage



PLANT DESCRIPTION

Plant Type:	Perennial
Height / Width:	4-6 ft H x 3-4 ft W
Plant Form:	Upright, spreading aggressively by rhizomes
Flower / Fruit:	Branched, 5-6 in. long stems, ½-in. intense sky blue flowers with white throat; summer thru fall
Leaf:	Smooth, green, lance-shaped, toothed, 3½ in. wide at base
Native To:	Lowlands of South America

GROWING REQUIREMENTS

Sunset Zones:	6-9, 14-24
Soil:	Well-drained, rich
Water:	Moderate
Sun:	Part shade
Care and Pruning:	In spring, pinch tips to promote bushiness, lightly prune for shape until early June. Cut to ground in winter. To restrain spreading, confine roots by planting in 15-gal. nursery can sunk into ground
